Flora Jean White, 79, of Cape Girardeau, Missouri died Wednesday, December 16, 2020 at her home.

Flo was born April 15, 1941 in West Morland, TN to Miller Dixon and Laura Pedigo Coley.

She received a degree from Union University in Jackson, TN. She taught in Missouri public schools for 47 years and was a member of ZTA College Sorority, ADK Teachers Soroity and was the first lady of the Executive Club in Cape Girardeau. Flora was very active in her church, Abbey Road Christian Church, serving as a deacon.
