James W. Underwood passed away Sunday, April 5, 2020 at the age of 82.

He was preceded in death by his beloved wife Martha Lou Hall Sitton, his parents John M. Underwood, Sr. and Frances (Gillespie) Underwood, sister Nelda Underwood (the late Thomas) Simpson, brother John M. Underwood, Jr., nephew Mark Underwood, and niece Jari Simpson VandenBerg.

Jim grew up on a farm in Stoddard County, MO near Leora graduating from Bloomfield High School in 1955.

He served in the U.S. Army from 1961 through 1965.

Jim received a B.S. Degree in Education and an M.A. Degree in Education from Southeast Missouri State College. In July 1987 Jim was awarded a Doctor of Education Degree in Educational Administration from the University of Missouri in Columbia, Missouri. He was a member of the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity and the MU Delta Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi, an international professional education honor society.

A lifelong educator, Jim taught at Illmo-Scott City High School; and served as principal of Oran High School. He was an administrator in the Columbia Public School District for 25 years, retiring in 1998 from his position as the Director of Buildings and Facilities and Administrative Assistant to the Director of Buildings Services for the Columbia Public School District. He was an accomplished woodworker, electrician and beekeeper.
