



Richard Jay Kump

October 31, 1925 - April 13, 2020

Richard Jay Kump was born October 31, 1925 in Pocatello, Idaho, one of five children. During World War II he served in the U.S. Navy as a sonar operator aboard a submarine rescue vessel. After the war, he earned a B.S. in Business from Idaho State College and did graduate studies in Switzerland, gaining expertise in German and French. While he worked as a CIC translator for the U.S. Army in Salzburg, Austria, he met Gardis Fietz, one of a pair of twins, who were soloists at the Landestheater (National Dance Theater.) Richard and Gardis married and had two daughters.

When the family moved back to the U.S., Richard earned an M.A. in Foreign Language Education from St. Louis University. He then began teaching German and French at Southeast Missouri State College, where he was a professor. Richard earned a PhD in Education from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale, and was a member of the Phi Kappa Phi honor society. He shared his passion for German culture and heritage in the community by co-founding a German club that held dinners and dances. He was also a member of St. Mary's Cathedral, where he served as a lector for many years. After touching the lives of countless students, he retired from Southeast Missouri State University. He was preceded in death by Gardis, his wife of over 50 years, and by two sisters and a brother. Doctor Kump is survived by one sister, two daughters, Tina and Maria, and four grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be planned later this summer.
