Alvin D Farless, 83, of Cape Girardeau, Missouri died Saturday, January 13, 2024 at Barnes Jewish Hospital in St. Louis

He was born April 19, 1940 in Canoga Park, CA to Jesse Austin Farless and Alice Adaline "Mae" Hawthorne Farless.

He and Jo Anne Killion were married in Chatsworth, CA at the Chapel on the Hill, on May 20, 1961.

Alvin worked in the Aviation industry. He began with Rocketdyne in 1958 when he was just 18 years old as a forklift driver in Los Angeles, CA. He worked with the company for over 55 years as it changed hands several times. In 1976 he was transferred from Los Angeles to Perryville MO to work with Sabreliner Corporation. He worked with many great people and became known as "Mr. Sabreliner" to many of those whom he worked with inside and outside the United States. He wrote government contracts working with Air Force One, the Shuttle program (many of the different shuttles), B1 Bombers, and helicopters for the Jordan government. He became the Vice President of Government contracts. Alvin loved his work. His integrity and hard work ethic are just some of his amazing characteristics. To know Alvin was to love him. His wit, love of family, love of his job, but most importantly, and a testimony to his last breath, was his love and service to his Lord and Savior.
