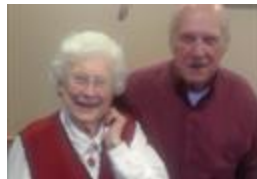

Thoughts from Greg:

The first memory of Mom I can remember is her coming into my bedroom when I was about 5 yrs. old. I was scared of the lights shining thru my window that were present on a wall from headlights from cars as they drove past our house on a nearby highway. She was always looking out for us.

Some of the memories that are most cherished would be when she would wait for me, as a driving teenager, to come home after my part-time job at a restaurant. She would always be up waiting for me to come in and would ask if I wanted anything to eat or drink. We spent most of that time talking about people and life. People and relationships were always a mystery to me because people's responses were not always the same, even though I had expected them to be that way. She would help me sort out most of those situations. Often, I would get home near the end of the St Louis Cardinals game and we would listen to that and talk during and after the game.

She was always very encouraging with me and my grades. A college scholarship was very important because we did not have money for college so I had to save up whatever I could.

She looked forward to going out with Jim whenever he played music because it was some "fun time" rather than just worrying about the bills and us boys. Her words were her best tools when dealing with me. The only words that concerned me was when the sentence started with "Gregory Lewis Best...!!!"

At one time, when I was not sure of her belief in God, I asked her whether I would see her in Heaven. I believe she took that to heart and began seeking Him. I think she made her choice later and now has gone to the room prepared for her.

She was passionate about Cardinal baseball and always wanted to go to St. Louis one more time but she just wouldn’t travel. When i was young

we watched STL Cardinal football games on TV on the weekends. She was a great mom and homemaker. Always had food in the kitchen and always prepping for her family. The house smelled like "home." Mom was always a hard worker and she never seemed to complain about working too much in those days!

When I think of mom I always think of her either in the kitchen making dinner, or sitting in our little living room at the Whitener house in Cape Girardeau, eating dinner off TV trays and watching football on Sundays. When I worked at Shakey's Pizza in the 1970's, I'd get off in the afternoon and bring home a pizza or some chicken, and we'd watch the football Cardinals play on Sunday afternoons.

She was decisive, opinionated, sweet and sometimes sour, giving and supportive! A lady whose strength carried her through 9 ½ decades. Being born the year the great depression started, she started an uphill battle to defeat the negative. Her life was a mix of pessimism and joy, as most of us, but coming from the time she lived the negative is understandable. Bonnie was loyal and committed to her husband and family and she faithfully took care of her aging mother in her latter years. She always brightened up at the least gift or bit of attention from a call, a card or a small gift. Each were treated as very special and made her almost giddy. Working hard in her employments and raising two boys to be strong and successful was her goal and she succeeded in that goal. Bonnie and Jim Married on March 14, 1967 at Westside Church of God in Cape Girardeau. This expanded the family to a household of 4 with Greg 13 and Doug 10 from Bonnie's former marriage to John Linden Best. The four became a new family as Jim and she worked as a team together for 57 years this past March. She was a strong supporter and team player as she worked, organized the household, cooked meals and paid all the bills. She ran a tight ship. She followed Jim around the countryside to hear him play bass guitar in several bands for decades even until recently and she loved the music and the dancing. Several months back Nancy and I joined her and Jim at the senior center where Jim played with a local band and all the old folks got out and danced. She had a blast and said she wished that she could still dance. Of course, she critiqued the band, the sound volumes and the temperature of the food that day and we entertained because of it. LOL

She was solid like a pillar in the home. She spoke often of her sons regretting that she had lived so far away from them and her grands. Whatever she put her hand to she was good at: like her sewing and management at the Flaming Pit where she was the head waitress. I'm pretty sure she is currently trying to manage the order of heaven! I've imagined Jesus setting her down at least once and saying "Bonnie, now sweet child, you're not in charge here." I got

along with Aunt Bonnie where others couldn't because we are similar in several ways. She was a bit OCD in her ways and couldn't sleep until a situation was just perfect (in her eyes anyway) and she had to talk and talk and talk every problem thoroughly out with someone until it was clear in her head.....She and I share that trait! The night before she died, I called her on video chat in her hospital room where the Cardinals game was playing on her TV. I prayed with her and made a big kissy face with 3 smooches and made her smile real big over the video (I wish I had recorded it), During this sweet and memorable moment, she motioned to the girl holding the video phone and motioning whispered (while I'm still on video chat mind you) "please turn up the game, I can't hear it." (LOL) so funny even 'til the end loving her sports!

I seemed to be therapist and an ear for her troubles (as were a few others like Liz the realtor that sold her their current home.) We were her spiritual advisors, therapists and psychiatrists and she talked to both of us for hours every week!

In recent years Bonnie would call me and tell me of her spiritual experiences in prayer. She informed me that in spite of the fact that she was baptized as a teen, only recently did she get more serious and one day she called me to tell me she had prayed with Charles Stanley on TV to be saved. Only last month she reported to me that she stayed up half the night praying and talking to God about why she was here. She wanted to go to heaven and just couldn't understand why she was still here on the planet.
