Charles James McCart, 76, of Egypt Mills, Missouri died Thursday, December 6, 2018 at Southeast Hospital.

He was born August 17, 1942 in Cape Girardeau, Missouri to Jewel Spencer and Marie Carrie Sapienza McCart.
