Constance Ann Wells of Fruitland, MO, 73, died Feb. 11, 2022 at Life Care Center in Cape Girardeau after recently being diagnosed with inoperable cancer.

Connie was born in Cape Girardeau Feb. 14, 1948, to Stanley and Irene (Ford) Richardson. She attended public schools in Cape and graduated from Cape Central High School in 1966.
