Don G. Huey, 77, of Jackson died Wednesday, April 8, 2009, at Saint Francis Medical Center in Cape Girardeau. He was born Dec. 18, 1931, in Egypt Mills, son of Tom and Justine Hengst Huey. He first married Marie Reimann on Dec. 18, 1951. She preceded him in death Sept. 5, 2001. He then married Sharon Williams on June 1, 2002.
