Edward McKinley Kaiser Sr., 95, of Cape Girardeau, Missouri died Monday, July 15, 2019 at Missouri Veteran's Home.

He was born March 23, 1924 in Flint, Michigan to William McKinley and Edna Southers Kaiser.

He and Sina Cox were married February 7, 1948 at Essex, Missouri. She preceded him in death on April 30, 2015.

He served in the Army, where he earned two purple hearts and a bronze star. He went in the second wave of Normandy under General George Patton through the Europe campaign to Berlin and assisted in the liberation in the Dachau concentration camp. He was one of the first men to go in to the north gate of Dachau watching the German's backs as they left the south gate.

He was a member of VFW, DAV and Honorary member of Cape Girardeau Rotary Club.

He was a member of First Presbyterian Church.

Survivors include his two daughters, Deborah (Eric) Ebaugh of Cape Girardeau, Missouri and Sina Ann (Stephen) Miesner of Ballwin, Missouri; one

daughter-in-law, Melinda Kaiser of Springfield, Missouri; eight grandchildren, William H. (Megan) York, Sarah Elizabeth (Matt) Watson, Christopher E. York, Clayton G. (Amanda) Agnew, Sina J.
