Elizabeth Ann Hogan, 78, of Jackson, Missouri died Sunday, January 30, 2022.

She was born April 21, 1943 in Knoxville, Iowa to Guy F. Andrews and Elizabeth Custis Andrews. She grew up on the family farm and graduated from Knoxville High School in 1961. She completed her baccalaureate degree at Phillips University in 1965 with a degree in religious education and earned her master's degree from Southeast Missouri State University.

She worked in the Cape Girardeau public school system for 29 years, first as an elementary school teacher and later as a psychological examiner.

She was a member of Christ Episcopal Church, where she served with the Commission on Ministry Board of Examining Chaplains for the Diocese of Missouri.
