



## Flodema "Flo" Brown

November 2, 1928 - February 16, 2019

Flodema "Flo" Brown, 90, of Cape Girardeau, Missouri, formerly of Chandler, Texas, entered Heaven's Gates on Saturday, February 16, 2019. Born in 1928 in Skiatook, Oklahoma, she is predeceased by her parents, Logan Augustus and Bertha Jane (Bigley) Holeman, her late husband of 53 years, Lee Vernon Brown, and her sister, Eileen Ozbun, all of Chandler, Texas.
