Frank retired from Missouri State Division of Employment Services in April 2000 after 32 years of service. He enjoyed playing tennis until his health no longer allowed. He participated in the U.S.

Transplant Games in Orlando, FL in 2002 competing in doubles tennis. His team placed 2nd in their age division. He was currently working at Howard's Athletic Goods Store part-time. He also served on the Missouri State Employees' Retirement System board.
