June 13, 1945 - April 25, 2026

Gerry Strohmeyer, 80, of Cape Girardeau, entered into eternal life on Saturday, April 25, 2026, at his home.

Born on June 13, 1945, in St. Louis, Gerry was the son of Frank Henry and Golda Mae (Graves) Strohmeyer. On January 21, 1967, he married the love of his life, Joan Frances Brown, at Our Lady of Loretto Church in St. Louis. Their marriage was deeply rooted in faith, devotion, and a love that continues to live on through their family. Joan preceded him in death on April 11, 2016, and we trust in the joy of their reunion in Christ.

Gerry was a graduate of Corpus Christi High School in St. Louis and attended Quincy College. He dedicated more than 40 years of his professional life as a human resources manager with SGL Carbon Corporation, serving in St. Louis, Ozark, Arkansas, and Hickman, Kentucky. He approached his work with integrity, care, and a genuine concern for the people around him.

At the center of Gerry's life was his Catholic faith, which he lived with conviction and joyful generosity. A devoted member of St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, he served his parish community in many ways, including parish council, many faith sharing groups and accompanying others through times of loss as part of the grief ministry.

Gerry was especially passionate about his involvement in Cursillo. Through this movement, he found deep friendship in Christ and spent years inviting others into a more personal and transformative relationship with God. His steady witness and encouragement left a lasting mark on countless lives. Gerry was also a founding contributor to The God Minute podcast, helping to bring prayer into the daily lives of listeners, a quiet but meaningful legacy of faith.

Gerry had a special gift for connecting with young people, and he shared that gift generously for decades. At Notre Dame Regional High School, where he was affectionately known as “GerBear,” he met students where they were and walked with them in faith. He served as a beloved substitute teacher, a steady and familiar presence in the halls, and a trusted chaperone on mission trips. Whether in the classroom, on the road, or simply in conversation, Gerry had a way of making young people feel seen, valued, and at home. His presence was constant, joyful, and deeply impactful.

Beyond his ministry, Gerry had a deep love for the arts and community life. He was a lifelong lover of live theatre. Starting in high school, theatre was a part of his life through acting, directing and enjoying as a member of the audience throughout his life. He directed parish youth ministry plays in the summers for 10 years. He was also the founding director of Foothills Little Theatre in Ozark, Arkansas, where his creativity and leadership brought people together.

Gerry is survived by his seven children: Barbara “Bobbi” Strohmeyer and Sarah Strohmeyer of Cape Girardeau; Martin Strohmeyer and Matthew (Jill) Strohmeyer of St. Louis; Daniel (Kayce) Strohmeyer of Washington, Missouri; Amanda Strohmeyer of Cape Girardeau; and Andrew Strohmeyer of St. Louis. He was a proud and loving grandfather to twelve grandchildren, his favorites: Lucas, Audrey, Sylvia, and Oliver Strohmeyer; James (Terra) Crawford; Anthony, Vincent, Elijah, Gunther, and Samuel Strohmeyer; Graysen

Manwarren; and Lydia Strohmeier. As the last surviving member and patriarch of the extended Strohmeier family, he was deeply connected to his many nieces, nephews, and great nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his beloved wife, Joan; and his siblings, Frank Strohmeier, Lorraine Saputo, Lawrence Strohmeier, Doris Graham, Patricia Allen, James, Robert, and Richard Strohmeier.

Gerry lived a life of faith in action, showing up, walking with others, and boldly pointing people toward Christ. His life was a constant invitation to love deeply, serve generously, and trust God always.

Visitation will be held from 4:30 to 8:00 p.m. on Friday, May 1, 2026, at St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church in Cape Girardeau.

A Funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 2, 2026, at St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, with Rev. Ron Hoye, CM officiating.

Interment will take place at Calvary Cemetery in St. Louis at a later date.

“ I first met Gerry when he came to substitute teach for Mrs. Ha's Spanish III class at Notre Dame. He had a brace on his wrist and forearm since he had injured his hand several days before. It happened as he was trying to catch a baseball that flew into the stands for one of his grandchildren at a Cardinals game. I could tell immediately that he was a man devoted to his family. Despite the large age gap between Gerry and my peers, we all felt like we could relate to him. We never really thought of him as being that old.

Later, I got to know Gerry better when I went on the Notre Dame Mission Trip to Tuba City, Arizona where he led the cooking crew. Several years later, he joined us on our Kairos retreat as an observer. It was on those occasions that I quickly saw how everyone wanted to be around Gerry. People would go over to his table during free time just to talk to him and joke around.

During my Senior year at Notre Dame, somehow a group of friends and I ended up doing a service project for Gerry at his house. He needed some help with yardwork. I'm pretty sure just a few people were supposed to go over there to start with, but once they found out they were going to Gerry's house they started inviting friends and the group grew. We all had a great time joking with him and playing with his tiny chihuahuas. I can't remember if much yardwork actually got done, but we all had fun.

My friend Dillon and I kept in touch with Gerry over the years after we graduated from Notre Dame. When Gerry found out we were working in New Mexico one summer, he gave us travel recommendations and encouraged us to visit the Holy Shrine of Chimayo there. At some point after we got back, he had us over for dinner and we had a good visit. He wanted to hear about everything we did and told us about his own trips to New Mexico.

Gerry was very dedicated to his relationship with Christ. I remember after college while I was still living in Cape Girardeau I would see him very frequently at the 6:00 AM daily Mass at St. Mary's. He

invited me over to the Wednesday morning Cursillo meeting following Mass one day. I could tell he was a patriarch figure to the rest of the men there. For some time, Gerry was on oxygen and had to use a cane as well. However, that did not stop him from coming to Daily Mass and Cursillo meetings.

May God be pleased to welcome his servant Gerry into His eternal kingdom. I pray for his repose and give thanks for the gift he was to me and so many other people. My prayers go out to his family and close friends during this time especially. God bless you all.

“Gerry (along with the whole Strohmeyer family) had a major impact on my life and so many young people's lives growing up in Cape Girardeau and in the St. Vincent's community.

I remember working set construction and various backstage jobs on several of the plays that Gerry directed at the St. Vincent's gym every summer. How he managed to get that many unruly teenagers to be completely silent backstage and to manage props and costumes and actor entrance cues and even some practical special effects, I'll never know. But the audience forgot they were watching a bunch of kids putting on a play and just got pulled into the story.

(They still don't know how, in one particular scene, a certain teenage girl, one G.H. I believe, was able to perfectly throw a knife across the room and embed it in a map on the wall. A lot of audience jaws had to be picked up off the floor after that scene!)

He taught us that we were capable of that - that when we worked together, using a whole host of disparate skills and talents, we were more than the sum of our parts. Without him, I would not have had that experience.

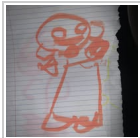

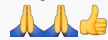
