Jacob Aubrey-Lynn Raines, 46, of Harlingen, Texas died Wednesday, November 20, 2024 at Southeast Georgia Hospital in Brunswick, GA.

He was born May 1, 1978 in Creve Coeur, MO to Robert & Shirley (Jett) Raines.

Jake was active in the Air Force from 1997-2001, with the rank of Senior Airman, as a Flying Crew Chief. He had been awarded the Air Force Achievement Medal, the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award, the Air Force Good Conduct Medal, and Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, and the Air Force Training Ribbon.

Jake was highly educated, earning two bachelor degrees from Southeast Missouri State University, a JD degree from Michigan State University Law School, and a Masters of Law from the University of Missouri-Kansas City. He was employed at the Department of Homeland Security Customs and Borders Protection as an attorney in Edinburg, TX. Prior, he served as an ICE attorney in Los Fresnos, TX. He worked hard and was able to be successful in all his endeavors. He also understood the values of living life to the fullest, enjoying traveling, fishing, golfing, scuba diving, and spending time with his friends and family.

Survivors include his parents; sister, Addie Raines; many other family and friends.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents, RB and Argie Raines, Herman and Sylvia Jett.

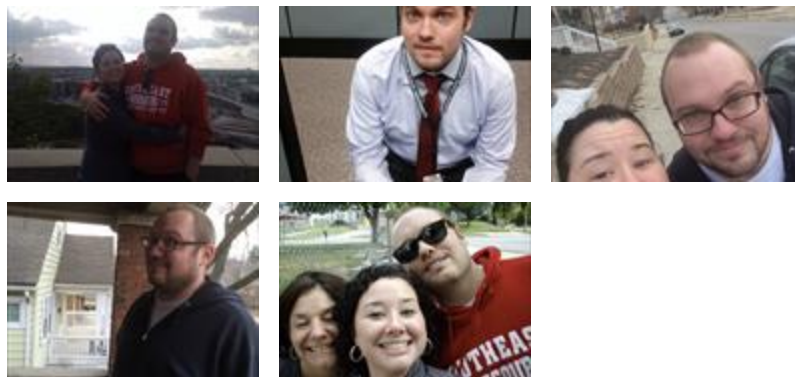

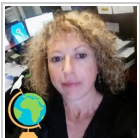

“ Jake was one of my first friends at Fairchild AFB. He always made a point to include me, invite me, make me feel welcome, and seem happy to see me. Jake made others feel seen, valued, important. I could write a whole series of books about our nearly thirty-year friendship but that will not fit here so I'll share some highlights. We had numerous running gags, or, inside jokes that were just as funny the first time as they were the thousandth time we reminisced about them. One referenced a time Jake thought it would be nice to take me to the Japanese garden near our apartment in Spokane. It was really beautiful but we had to leave because he accidentally pushed me into the koi pond. He felt so terrible and I couldn't stop laughing the whole way home.

We emailed to communicate when I was in Turkey, and Jake had just moved into our apartment. He wrote that he "found a bunch of old posters" and "threw them in the garbage". The truth was he found my posters from France, framed and hung them. Forever a thoughtful goofball.

We had so much fun together and even physical distance and decades of time couldn't get in the way of our bond. I will always consider him to be the best friend I've ever had.

Jake and I have the same awards/medals/ribbons from serving together in the AF at Fairchild, and in Saudi Arabia and Spain. Whenever only one of us had work, we would join the other to help each other. Jake made everything fun. Everything, always. I smile just seeing his name. I've never known anyone like him, before or since meeting him. I told Karl the other day that Jake was joy, personified. His absence is palpable, but his legacy is how he made people feel, which was beautiful.

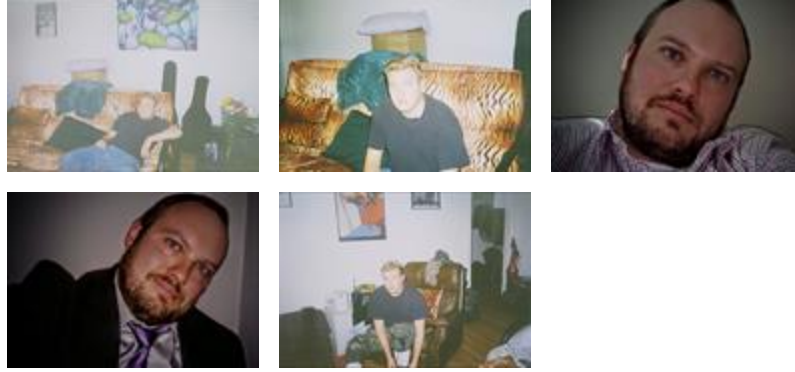
I wish I had more photos of him. The ones where he's a kid were taken by me in our apartment, plus the one of us in front of our building. The others are photos he sent me, per my request.
