It was the call you don’t expect to get. Her voice was softer, serious. She told me she was on hospice and there was nothing more the doctors could do for her stage four cancer. She had planned her funeral. I was speechless, then in tears. She was trying to be positive and comfort me and she was the terminal one. That was Linda. Always thinking of others.

Whether it would be her parents, her friends, her animals, her job or anyone she’d meet on the street, she always made you smile and feel better, even when she was suffering. Our conversation was different. I could feel the pain in her voice, as she spoke about her excruciating disease. What the next journey entailed. The spiritual one. But among it all, she still managed to make me smile when she spoke about one of her favorite video shoots of all time. We worked with country music star Clint Black and Tracy McSherry for the Steppin’ Out Country TV Show for KFVS12. She had a crush on him from that day forward. That was Linda. She was truly a beautiful, caring person, a servant of God. A bright light in this world. Her presence will be missed. Thank you Linda. God Bless you friend.
