Lou Nathaniel Hannaford, 90, of Cape Girardeau, MO died Thursday, June 5, 2014 in Cape Girardeau, MO. He was born April 4, 1924 in Roodhouse, IL to Oscar Minor and Blanche Mae Rudd Hannaford.
