Louise Caroline Sanders, 94, passed away Thursday August 16, 2012 at The Chateau Girardeau in Cape Girardeau. She was born October 2, 1917 in Brownville, Nebraska, daughter of Kenneth and Amelia Clary Young. She and Reece Watson Sanders were married August 12th, 1939 in Brownville. She was a member of the First Christian Church. Sanders obtained a teaching certificate from Peru (Nebraska) State College and later completed a Bachelor of Science and a Masters Degree in Education at Southeast Missouri State University. She taught eighth grade reading at Cape Central Junior High for many years before retiring in 1978. Survivors include her husband of 73 years, Reece; two sons, Laurence (Cathy) of St. Charles and David (Donna) of Cape Girardeau; five grandchildren, Doug Sanders of St. Charles, Marcia Voges (Chad) of St. Peters, Ashlei Sterling (John), Trenton Sanders, and Kristyn Sanders, all of Cape Girardeau, and 7 great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents and a brother, Laurence.
