Martha Wilson Cairns, 97, of Cape Girardeau, MO died Thursday, June 5, 2014 at Southeast Hospital in Cape Girardeau. She was born July 15, 1916 in Sparta, IL to John T. and Amy Morrow Wilson. She and Austin R. Cairns were married September 8, 1936 at Sparta, Illinois. He preceded her in death May 12, 1998. In 1978 Martha and her husband retired to New Port Richey, FL. and remained nineteen years. They moved to Cape Girardeau in May of 1997. She was a life long member of the Presbyterian faith and a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Cape Girardeau. She helped organize the Residents Organization at Saxony Village and served as its first president. Martha also served as president and vice president of the Lutheran Home Auxiliary.
