Mildred Mae Eakins Cox died on Wednesday, November 26, 2008, at The Lutheran Home in Cape Girardeau, Missouri. She was 83 years of age. Mildred was born on March 2, 1925, near Advance, in Cape Girardeau County, Missouri, daughter of George Lee and Bertha May Miller Eakins. She and Comelous G. (C. G.)
