Early Sunday morning May 18, 2025, the Lord welcomed Nancy Lee Hobbs home. She passed peacefully, surrounded by her family, comforted by love and faith.

She was born March 9, 1945, in Anna, Il., daughter of George and Clara Kenney Livesay.

Nancy Hobbs was the heart of five generations. A loving mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, and great-great-grandmother who filled every role with warmth, grace, and an unmistakable spark. She had a legendary sense of humor. Whether donning a gorilla suit to a family gathering or crafting jaw-dropping Halloween costumes, Nancy brought joy wherever she went. She never met a costume she couldn't improve or a grandkid she couldn't (lovingly) outmatch at cards or video games-though she always insisted she was "just lucky."

Nancy was equally at home in the kitchen or near a fishing hole-both places where she worked her magic with a knife in hand. Armed with her trusty "watermelon" lure, she could out-fish just about anyone, then return home to turn her catch, or anything else for that matter, into a meal that brought the whole family to the table. Her kitchen was a place of comfort, laughter, and second helpings, where stories were shared as freely as the mashed potatoes.

Above all, Nancy was a woman of faith. A devoted member of New Bethel Baptist Church, she lived her life with kindness, conviction, and an unwavering love for the Lord. Her legacy is one of joy, strength, and spirited devotion-a life fully, beautifully, and memorably lived.

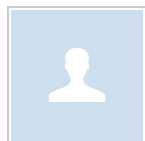
