Primm L. "Lee" Voss, 73, of Cape Girardeau died Friday, March 27, 2009, at Southeast Missouri Hospital. He was born Aug. 17, 1935, in Seventy-Six, Mo., the son of Primm John and Fayette Parker Voss.
