She not only devoted her life to the Lord but was the foundational rock in the spiritual lives of many of her loved ones. Shirley was also well versed and well-traveled as she and her late husband Arthur, made numerous trips to Mexico, and also trips to Europe and China. They also traveled all over the United States in search of adventure, and especially to watch baseball games of their son Yancy, and later to see their grandson Kolten.

She brightened any room she walked in with her vocal presence, glowing smile, and booming laugh. She also spiced up the lives of many as she would debate over just about anything, politics being her specialty. Shirley Poorman founded her life on her walk with her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Through all her travels, adventures, and lessons she has finally reached the destination she had been longing for.
