Terry E. Crowell, 81 years old, of Cape Girardeau, died October 6, 2023.

He was born October 12, 1941, in Marquand, Missouri to Hughey and Dorothy Mouser Crowell.

He and Terry A. Crowell were married April 19, 1969, at Centenary United Methodist Church in Cape Girardeau. Terry and Terry celebrated 51 years of marriage before she passed in 2020.

Terry was a 1960 graduate of Poplar Bluff High School. He joined the United States Air Force in July 1960. He was honorably discharged from active and reserve duty in July 1966. Terry served 13 months in Korea.

Terry retired in August 2008 after 40 years working for Associated Building Centers (Huttig). A long-time member of Centenary Methodist Church, Terry served in a variety of leadership roles with his wife. He was a past president of the Cape Girardeau Kiwanis Club and past president of Cape Girardeau Country Club.

Terry is survived by sons, Jason (Casey) Crowell of Cape Girardeau and Josh (Theresa) Crowell of Jackson; granddaughters, Morgan (Brian) Russell of Saint Peters, Isabella, Alaina and Sophia Crowell of Jackson and Laura

He was preceded in death by his parents and brother, Stephen Crowell.
