Virginia Vinyard Bailey passed away on July 8, 2012 at Chateau Girardeau. Born in Cape Girardeau on November 16, 1916 to Benjamin and Lura Gee Vinyard, she spent most of her life in Portageville, Mo. She is survived by her husband, Judge John R. Bailey retired, three daughters Barbara Bailey Bradford of St. Louis, Marcia Bailey Planchon of Memphis, TN, and Rebecca Bailey Betz of Cape Girardeau, seven grandchildren and seventeen great-grandchildren. Mrs. Bailey is a graduate of the University of Missouri, Columbia where she was a member of Kappa Alpha Theta sorority and earned degrees in French and English. She taught French at Portageville High School for 16 years and traveled extensively with her husband to over thirty countries on five continents, but her favorite destination was always France where they returned on numerous trips. Mrs. Bailey was a charter member of P.E.O. chapter GU in Portageville and became a member of chapter BI in Cape Girardeau when she and Judge Bailey moved here nine years ago. She was also active in the Portageville Garden Club and the Girl Scouts of America. Judge and Mrs. Bailey were long-time members of the Portageville United Methodist Church, but upon moving to Cape Girardeau, she returned to the church of her youth, First Presbyterian Church. Funeral services for Mrs. Bailey will be held at 2:30 p.m. on Friday, July 13 at Ford and Sons Funeral Home at 1001 N. Mt. Auburn Road in Cape Girardeau. The Rev. Bill Vincent will officiate. Visitation will precede the service beginning at 1:30 p.m. Burial will follow at Cape County Memorial Park.
